Dear Mr. Edelman:

This letter responds to your request, dated and received in this office on March 30, 2015, for all consumer complaints concerning Empire State Realty Trust Inc. from March 1, 2012 through December 31, 2013.

Access is granted to the enclosed 2 pages of records, except for a third-party name, telephone number, and other personally identifiable information. This information is being withheld pursuant to Exemption 6 of the FOIA, since its release would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

Additionally, we are withholding 4 pages of records that are contained in the SEC's Tips, Complaints and Referrals (TCR) System in their entirety. These records are protected from release pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(3), (6), (7)(A), (7)(C) and (7)(D), 17 CFR § 200.80(b)(3), (6), (7)(i), (7)(iii) and (7)(iv), for the following reasons:

- Under Exemption 3, certain information is specifically exempted from disclosure by statute. Pursuant to 15 USC § 78u-6, the Commission shall not disclose any information, including information provided by a whistleblower to the Commission, which could reasonably be expected to reveal the identity of a whistleblower.
- Under Exemption 6, the release of the records would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

- Exemption 7(A) protects from disclosure records compiled for law enforcement purposes, the release of which could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement activities. 1
- Under Exemption 7(C), the release of the records could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.
- Exemption 7(D) provides protection for records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes which could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of a confidential source which furnished information on a confidential basis.

I am the deciding official with regard to this adverse determination. You have the right to appeal my decision within 90 calendar days from the date of this letter to our General Counsel under 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(6), 17 CFR § 200.80(d)(5) and (6). Your appeal must be in writing, clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal," and should identify the requested records. The appeal may include facts and authorities you consider appropriate.
